YOU BREAK THE HABIT**

Kennewick, WA – Tobacco use is responsible for 1 in 5 deaths and we want to help you break the habit! The Tri-Cities Cancer Center, a leader in radiation oncology in southeastern Washington and northeastern Oregon, will host three tobacco cessation presentations throughout January in their Resource Center. Cindy Miller, RN, CBPN-IC will facilitate the presentation ***Tobacco Cessation***.



To help those who are ready to break the habit, the Tri-Cities Cancer Center offers these presentations at no charge.

Smoking accounts for at least 30% of all cancer deaths and 87% of lung cancer deaths. The Tri-Cities Cancer Center encourages smokers to quit. By doing so, smokers will be taking an important step towards a healthier life – one that can lead to reducing cancer risk. Quitting smoking is not easy, but it can be done. To have the best chance of quitting successfully, smokers need to know what they are up against, the options, and where to go for help.

This program will help identify triggers, come up with ways to beat them, and discuss the use of nicotine replacement therapy. The “e-cigarette” will also be discussed and demonstrated. Nicotine replacement patches will be available at no cost to first time participants.
